- 1. November 14 Wednesday Det. Sgt. Ken Lenning spoke at Northampton Community College's OPEN house to Criminal Justice Students and Criminal Justice Club to educate approximately 80 people about crime scene.
- 2. November 14 Wednesday Det. Sgt. Ken Lenning met with State Representative Mario Scavello in regards to writing and introducing legislature to correct an issue that has led to children being victimized in our jurisdiction. He was accompanied by a mother of a victim child. There are no provisions (laws) governing, directing or mandating private businesses (daycares, karate studios, churches, etc) to conduct background (clearances) on employees, volunteers or other persons interacting with children. The subject is being researched and it is our hope that new legislation will be introduced and passed to correct this oversight.
